Mission and aims

- ECHOES' mission is to set up the European Collaborative Cloud for Cultural Heritage (ECCCH), a shared platform designed to facilitate collaboration among heritage professionals and researchers, providing them with access to data, scientific resources, training, and advanced digital tools tailored to suit their needs.
- The final aim is to strengthen the European Research Area and EU leadership in research for cultural heritage



• ECHOES' consortium includes 15 umbrella organisations representing **more than 1000 organisations in Europe**, and a variety of disciplines:



The Digital Commons

ECHOES will create a Digital
 Continuum, based on a Digital
 Ecosystem, which will empower users
 to interact with, manipulate and
 enrich Digital Twins, leading to new,
 jointly developed scientific
 knowledge.

 This digital environment will allow the creation of a new generation of heritage objects, the **Digital Commons**, which are semantically rich and collectively produced.



ECHOES Pillars



Community Pillar

Aims to build and organise the ECCCH community by leveraging the various sectors of CH and provides essential training to facilitate the adoption and use of the Cloud.



Knowledge Pillar

Responsible for creating the cloud infrastructure and setting up the CH Knowledge Base.



Innovation Pillar

Focuses on the development of user-friendly vertical applications and on the assessment of the ECCCH digital ecosystem.



Aims to establish a legal entity to ensure the cloud's economic, social, and environmental sustainability, securing its leadership both in the EU and globally.




Transversal Pillar

Includes all the activities dedicated to management and communication, as well as enhancing collaboration and integrating data and tools from various projects and complementary initiatives.





Cross-issues

- Design the infrastructure with and for user communities
 - Diversity of communities
 - Interdisciplinary
 - Inter-institutional
 - Level of commitment to the digital turn
 - Different needs
 - Data access
 - Data production
 - Uses and purposes: consultation, processing, calculation, display...
 - They address the same cultural heritage assets but do not necessarily define them in the same way (vocabularies, ontologies, scale of analysis...)


Added value of the Cultural Heritage Cloud

- Offering a Single Entry Point
 - Make access as simple and straightforward as possible for users
 - Avoid redundancy wherever possible
- Guarantee data quality
 - Technical quality
 - Scientific quality of data
- FAIR publication DATA and services
- Digital Commons



The EU ecosystem

- ECHOES must set up the European Collaborative Cloud for Cultural Heritage (ECCCH) by involving the National initiatives for Cultural Heritage.
- ECCCH should also interact with the Data Space for Cultural Heritage and the European Open Science Cloud (EOSC). ECHOES' vision is that these 3 European initiatives should come together around the new concept of Digital Commons.





- ECHOES Cascading Grants Programme will allow the testing of tools and applications developed outside the consortium to integrate them into the ECCCH
- Three Open Calls will be published:
 - Call 1: Data (expected to be published in February 2025 12 projects, 60.000 € per project)
 - Call 2: Engagement and Collaboration (expected to be published in Autumn 2025 20 projects, 30.000 € per project)
 - Call 3: Data and Vertical Applications (expected to be published in Autumn 2026 18 projects, 60.000 € per project)



Get involved

ECCCH's calls

- Three-phase support by Horizon Europe: 2023, 2024, 2025
- 20 projects to integrate into the Cultural Heritage Cloud
